William Fitzgerald is Professor of Latin Language and Literature at King's College London. After a BA in Classics at Oxford (1974), he took a PhD at Princeton University in Comparative Literature (1981) and then taught in the States for many years, at the University of California (San Diego and Berkeley). He returned to the UK in 2003 to teach at Cambridge and moved to King's in 2007.

*He has published extensively on various topics of Latin poetry and prose, comparative literature and classical reception. His publications include *Variety: the Life of a Roman Concept* (University of Chicago Press, 2016), *Slavery and the Roman Literary Imagination* (CUP, 2000), and *Catullan Provocations* (University of California Press, 1995).*
