Associate Professor Zachary Munn is an advocate for evidence-based healthcare and for ensuring patients receive the best care possible based on the best available evidence. His main work is as a systematic review, evidence implementation and guideline development methodologist. He is the Director of the JBI Adelaide GRADE Centre and the Chair of the Guidelines International Network. He is supported by an NHMRC Investigator Grant to improve evidence synthesis methods.

He is involved in many systematic reviews and guideline projects, but perhaps the most rewarding part of his role is the chance to work hands on with clinicians and health services to facilitate the implementation of evidence into practice, particularly in low resource and LMIC settings.
