Having completed her Ph.D. in Roman History at Columbia University in 2004, Professor Liu is an established scholar whose publications include research monographs, chapters in edited volumes, and other academic texts in both English and Chinese. Most recently, her *Ovid in China: Reception, Translation, and Comparison,* co-edited with Thomas J. Sienkewicz, was published by Brill in 2022.
